CURRICULUM ORGANISATION

Year 7 forms are organised by friendship groups based on information from our primary feeder schools. Once our year 7 pupils have settled into school, their groups are adapted to suit their ability needs. Their form and house however remain the same. We also have an Induction Support Facility in which students gain additional support that allows them to thrive in secondary school. In years 8 and 9 the year groups are split into two halves in which the classes are broadly banded according to performance and potential. In addition there are two smaller classes which permit greater individual needs to be addressed.
